

Massey Police have set up the very successful Massey Community Patrol – CPNZ. It has been running now for about 12 months.

CPNZ are a group of volunteers who are all Police vetted, trained, tasked by Police and work as eyes and ears for Police. They always work in pairs. Each patrol is logged onto Police DCC (District Command Centre) and has direct contact to Police Communications. Each person must agree to and sign a Code of Conduct and Confidentiality agreement.

Following the abduction incident in Ranui, they started running ‘School Patrols’ - just an hour in the morning and again in the afternoon.

However, numbers of volunteers are limited. Massey Community Patrol has therefore come up with an initiative of having a dedicated roster of ‘school patrollers’.

Their plan is if they can recruit at least 20 volunteers, train them and roster them then they would only be asking for 1 hour a week from volunteers to cover this important role.

## **SCHOOL PATROLS**

Parents, Caregivers, Grandparents, Aunts, Uncles or anyone who wants to help out.

Massey Community Patrol – CPNZ has been endeavouring to cover morning and afternoon “school patrols” in order to help keep our little people safe. This has stretched our volunteer resources to the limits.

What we are proposing is a roster of people such as yourselves, giving us a commitment of a 1hr (give or take) rostered patrol, once a week either morning or afternoon (your choice) as dedicated school patrollers.

There is no limit to the number of people we can take on and Massey Patrol has two cars so it would be ideal to utilise both of them at all times.

Community Patrols work as eyes and ears only for Police (As eyes and ears only, you are never asked to put yourself in any danger). You will need to pass Police vetting, we will put you through training and Health and Safety and you always work in pairs. Patrollers will need to sign a Code of Conduct and a Confidentiality agreement.

Each patrol is logged onto Police DCC (District Command Centre) and has direct contact to Police Communications.

Age is no barrier (our members range from 18 – 80) and we will take as many hours as you want to give. You’ll be part of a great team of like minded people who are helping to take care of our community.
